
DIRECTIONS

TRAVELING I-84 EAST or WEST

Take exit 43 (Park Road – W. Hartford Center) Take a right off the exit onto Park Road East and immediate left at the light onto Trout Brook Drive. Continue 2.2 miles on Trout Brook Drive. Take a left at the light onto Albany Avenue. Continue a short distance on Albany Avenue. At the second light, turn right onto Starkel Road. The West Hartford Senior Center is on your left.

TRAVELING I-91 NORTH or SOUTH

Take I-91 to exit 35B (CT-218 West toward Windsor/Bloomfield) Turn right onto CT-218 West. After 6.3 miles, turn left onto Starkel Road. The West Hartford Senior Center will be on your right.
